- Influenza vaccine shortages

- VIS once available; how much vaccine will be produced; influenza viruses the vaccine will immunize against; notification of any shortages; new technologies in manufacturing of vaccine; free posters if available in our state; ideas on getting people vaccinated, especially HCWs
- Quantity and availability
- Updated educational materials
- Sources for posters and hand-outs
- E-mail reminder when meeting minutes available on the Web site
- Information on when vaccine will be available, quantity of vaccine, any anticipated problems/shortages/issues
- Better and more complete vaccine tracking; help with drumming up advertising for influenza vaccine if the organization has funding for that purpose, i.e., to help “get the word out” for other organizations that are running vaccine clinics
- Estimated arrival time of vaccine
- Information about vaccine availability, plans for community clinics
